Formal child care includes long day care, preschool/ kindergarten or family day care.



This year we'll be celebrating Book Week (Saturday 19 August to Friday 22 August) with a Book Week Playgroup in our Prospect Play Room. We'll be focusing on the national Book Week theme of 'Connect to Reading' with the Scholastic Book Fair theme 'Catch the Reading Bug'.

Come along or celebrate Book Week with your Playgroup. We've come up with some garden-themed dress up ideas that you might like to try...

The Very Hungry Caterpillar

- Dress as a caterpillar by wearing the colour green (t-shirt/jumper and leggings/ tights/pants). Make antenna by attaching two pipe-cleaners to a clear headband and attaching pom-poms to the top ends of the pipe cleaners. Tape or pin pictures of the foods the hungry caterpillar ate.
- You may like to dress as the butterfly from the story. Make butterfly wings by painting and/or decorating wings cut from a large piece of cardboard. Use pieces of elastic looped and attached to the wings to thread arms through.

Other Dress Up Ideas

- You can also attach pom-poms, foam balls or cotton balls to pipe cleaners and thread them through a beanie instead of a headband.
- Using the butterfly wings idea, cut different shapes from cardboard to create a snail/ turtle shell, ladybug, bee, fly, bird, owl
- Make masks from cardboard and attach with thin elastic or attach the mask to a popstick for children to hold over their face.
- Use a cheap pillow case in the colour you require, cut out holes for the childs arms and head and use a belt or long piece of material to hold it in at the waist. This provides a base and you can add whatever decoration your child would like.
- Dress as a bookworm. Wear green, a pair of large glasses and a bow-tie. Carry a bag of your favourite books / a bag with pictures of your favourite books.

Spring Garden Craft Ideas

With spring just around the corner, we have some spring garden craft activities for you to try with your little ones.

On a nice, spring day you could go on a nature walk around the garden or a park and see what plants are flowering, you may even find some bugs and insects.

You could write a list of what you find or have a checklist of what you can look for e.g. a flower, leaf, tall tree, stick, bark, ladybug, caterpillar, butterfly.

How does a Caterpillar Go?

(Hold one hand out flat and create a caterpillar with a finger from your other hand)

How does at Caterpillar go? Dear me does anybody know? How does a Caterpillar Go? On a cabbage leave the whole day long

Here is a beehive

Here is a beehive (create a fist with your hands) But where are the bees? Hiding inside where nobody sees See them come flying out of the hive One, two, three, four, five

Buzzzzzz, buzzzzzz, buzzzzzz

Ladybugs

Have fun creating a variety of coloured bugs. Trace around a circle shape on a piece of black paper/card and also on a piece of coloured paper/card. Cut out circles and then cut a small arc out of the coloured piece. Glue together. Use dot stickers for spots, and add googly eyes or just draw them on.



Patty Pan Spring Flowers

Use coloured patty pans to create spring flowers. Experiment with cutting the patty pans into different shapes and gluing different colours together. Use smaller patty pans, pom-poms, cotton balls, foam or felt pieces for the centre of the flowers. Attach flowers to pop-sticks and add leaves cut from paper or green patty pans.

You could extend this idea and create a garden. Cover a cracker box with green paper, poke some small holes in one side and stand up your flowers.

Tulip Paintings

Pour some paint colours onto a tray or use an ice-cream lid. Using a fork put it into the paint and press it onto paper to create tulipshaped flowers. Use a paint brush or your finger to paint stems.

Have fun singing some songs about insects that can be found in gardens

Read a Story

It is never too early to introduce children to the enjoyment that can be gained from reading. Reading books with children provides them with important information about how written language works. They find out about the way to hold a book and how to turn the pages, see what written words look like, and that you read from left to right and top to bottom.

If you have the space available at Playgroup, display a variety of books for the children to look at and talk about. Include some cushions to make this area comfortable and inviting.

When introducing stories at Playgroup, parents/ carers may choose to read to only one child, a small group, or the whole group together. Choose a book with a story that is appropriate to the developmental level and interests of the children. Children of Playgroup age usually have limited attention spans so stories generally work best if they are only short. Illustrations also help to maintain children's attention - there are many beautiful children's picture books available. Some of the children may have a favourite book they would like to share at Playgroup. You could also choose to select a book from your local library.



Tell a story in your own words

Try telling the children a story without reading from a book. It doesn't have to be word perfect but be sure you know the storyline. This may encourage children to attempt retelling stories in their own words, and then make up their own stories.

Extension ideas...

Encourage the children to act out stories by having some dress ups and pretend play props available for their use.

Make up your own Playgroup story! Photos of members could be used to illustrate it.

Use musical instruments to add sound effects to stories.

Tell stories using felt or magnetic pieces and board.

Draw a Story

Children will enjoy watching stories being illustrated while they listen to them being told. Use a large sheet of paper so that everyone is able to see. This could be attached to an easel, or stuck to a wall.

You might like to start with a story that the storyteller and the children know well. Stories which end up where they began, eg. Pamela Allen's, 'A Lion in the Night', work especially well

This method of storytelling also lends itself well to made up stories, eg. a story about the children at Playgroup. Encourage the children to come up with their own ideas for characters, and the story line, while an adult draws. This is a good opportunity for the parents/carers to model good listening skills.

Because young children's attention spans are limited, this is an activity that could carry on in short bursts over a period of weeks. Perhaps there could be one or two drawings done at each session, and then all the pictures put together in book form when the story is complete.

Extension ideas...

Encourage the children to retell stories using the drawings done during story time.

Use the drawing as a guide in setting up obstacle courses that the children can use in dramatising the story.

Encourage the children to have a go at drawing stories themselves by having the paper on the easel and some drawing materials in the book corner or storytelling area. Ask them to tell you a story about their picture.



OLD COTTAGE PLAYGROUP

Improvements...

Last month we were successful with our grant application to Rotary Club of Noarlunga East to upgrade our garden to a Sensory & Edible Garden. Our wish was to transform our garden by painting the wine barrels, planting fragrant herbs, and re-introducing our vege patch to our members. We also wanted to include a music wall with pots and pans attached to it for the kids to make their own music.

Following a meeting at the Old Cottage with Graham and Tony from Rotary, we agreed on the work to be completed as well as a special project – building a new sandpit.

We mapped out the work and time we thought it would take and put the call out for volunteers to assist with the work. This outside work coincided with inside works we had negotiated with the Onkaparinga Council – new cupboards, flooring, replacing sewage pipes and a fresh coat of paint.

Over the course of 2 weeks, we removed the old wooden sandpit, centred and re-concreted the swing set, painted our wine barrels and planted new flowers, succulents,

> herbs and vegetables - and a music wall has been erected. Inside was painted, flooring repaired, and all of the toys have been scrubbed clean and packed into our new cupboards.

The area we mapped out for the new sand pit had a tree for shade, but that tree was dying so down it came. We started digging to set the posts for the sand pit and found a drainage ditch, and the work went on hold again. Council engaged a plumber to sure the site whilst they were on site they fixed our storm-water drainage, and we continued on. But we ran out of time and had to open, so the sand pit

is currently secured and waiting completion (which we hope to have done by mid August).

This project would have cost us in excess of \$8,000 if it weren't for the kind donations, discounts, support and volunteering provided by Onkaparinga Council, Rotary, Outback Sleepers Australia, Lonsdale Sand & Metal, Pimpala Landscape Supplies, Mitre 10 Reynella, members of our Playgroup & the Committee and their extended families. From the bottom of our hearts we say Thank You.
