Preparing your PLAYGROUPER for kindy

& S S S

Read Stories about Kindy/ School

In the lead up to starting
Kindergarten or school,
read lots of books together
with your child about the
school experience. This is a great
conversation starter and will assist in
preparing them to know what it's
all about. If your child is fearful or
anxious about going to Kindergarten

or school, reading school related stories will assist to draw out such fears so that they can be reassured and well informed about what to expect. Most public libraries have loads of books about school for various ages.

Become familiar with the Kindergarten or School

Take a walk or drive past the kindy/school grounds in which your child will attend. Talk with them about what looks exciting and fun and have discussions around how they will get there and who will be picking them up.

Encourage Independence

Encourage your child to do things on their own... thorough hand washing, getting themselves dressed, putting on their own shoes (and learning how to tie shoe laces), going to the toilet, dressing, opening their own lunch box and drink bottle and unwrapping their own food.

Practice


Assist your child to practice putting on their hat and remembering to put things away in their bag, etc. If they would like, play "schools" at home with them – take turns being the teacher and the student by turning it into a fun game of pretend play.

Name Recognition

Teach your child to recognise their own name when written (this will come in very handy, especially when they're having to sort through all of the hats in the lost property tub at school). You can do this in a fun and playful way – print out their name and stick it up in surprise places around the house, place it amongst other names and see if they can pick which name is theirs and/or write the individual letters of their name on cards and see if they can practice putting the letters in the right order.

Writing their Name

Teach your child to write their own name. It can be fun! Remember to teach them the lowercase version (with caps for the first letter). There are so many fun ways to learn to write ones name. Try starting with preparing their name in dot form so that they can trace it and get used to performing the actions. le...



An exciting build up

Take your child on an exciting trip, if possible make it all about them and leave siblings who aren't starting school at home. Have an adventure where your child can pick their own lunch box, a special bit of stationary, school shoes/bag and anything else that you need to buy.

Talk to school children

If you know other families that attend the school (or other schools), get them to talk to your child about the school and what they love about it. Your child will feel comfortable knowing that others have had a starting school experience and that they know older kids at the school.

ON THE FIRST DAY... Let them settle in

If possible, stay a little while to make sure your child knows where to go, where the toilets are and where to put their bag on the first day. Show your child where you will meet them at the end of their first day.

Don't cry

I know, right. How did your baby get to this age already? Although this is probably an emotional time for you as a parent/caregiver, it's important to try not to cry in front of them on their first day – even if it's happy tears. Encourage independence by giving your child a reassuring and short goodbye without tears. Tears may confuse them and contradict all of the conversations you've previously had with them about enjoying their kindy/school experience.

Something from home

It may be helpful to give your child something to keep with them throughout their school day if they are feeling particularly anxious. This could be a photo of their family/pet stuck inside of their school diary/home book, a special gift from you (a badge, bracelet, special tag on their bag) or even a pair of lucky socks or lucky underwear.

Establish a routine

Try your best to make the chaos of school mornings into a fun and happy routine. Include a daily cuddle, a nutritious breakfast, maybe some independent play time if time permits, the application of sun screen and brushing their teeth and play

their favourite song in the car when travelling to school. Children are more likely to be confident and willing to cooperate when they can predict what is coming next - resulting from a routine.

Children attending kindergarten or school for the first time can often experience an increased level of tiredness. Families need to keep this in mind and allow time after school for rest and quite time - do something familiar, get them into comfy clothes and prepare a healthy snack.



Throughout your child's preschool and school years, prepare a scrapbook memento with them. Collate some of their best projects, drawings and photos and as their abilities develop, let them add their own pictures and script. This will be fun and a fab keepsake for them to always treasure.



















Reindeer & Christmas Tree Cards/Prints

Paint both hands with brown paint using a paint brush and stamp on paper as seen below. Once paint has dried, add the mouth and feet using a texta. Use pom poms for the nose and collar. Use a googly eye sticker or paint the eye on.

Paint foot with green paint, then stamp it onto paper and add the string of lights using texta. Decorate with coloured cardboard circles and glue. Add a cardboard star at the top.







Snowman Snow Dome

Use a small drink bottle and stuff it with cotton balls. To incorporate numeracy you can count the cotton balls and use language such as 'empty' and 'full'. Secure the lid and glue the lid. Decorate using stickers and a permanent marker.





















Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtle Baubles

Cut ribbon or felt in purple, blue, orange and red, then glue around the ball and add eyes. Hang on the Christmas tree. Aren't these the best!?!

Cookie Cutter Stamps

Paint the edge of the cutter with a paint brush and stamp away.

Alternatively, use glue instead of paint and then decorate the glue shapes with glitter, sequins and other craft materials.

This makes great wrapping paper!



A change in the process of school intake has prompted a demand for stimulating ideas and activities for 4-5 year old Playgroupers, prior to school entry.

Pre-schoolers need and respond well to structure. They are more capable of managing intense emotions and they require routine to avoid feeling overwhelmed. Pre-school age children start to display more curious and questioning behaviours... they are more prone to pushing the boundaries and they often love to experiment with exploration and risk taking.
